As at 29 February this year we had 816 financial members, a substantial increase from the same time last year. The Centre is thriving,

Your Board is constantly looking for new and exciting ideas to further enhance ways to accommodate the volume of members and visitors. Our Venue Manager works tirelessly finding and providing interesting events that will attract members and visitors alike.

There are the Working Together Groups ranging from pottery to quilting, lead lighting to painting. Every weekday there are groups enjoying the company of others with like interests, enjoying fellowship whilst working away at their craft, and gathering over a beverage from the Café.
